upheaval in  
the late

Chris Stamey  
remembers,  
“the old guard  
had become  
bloated,  
cartoonish,  
and widely co-  
opted by a  
search for

maximum  
corporate  
profits, and  
we wanted  
none of it.” In

auteur  
explosion  
happening in  
New York

CBGB as  
Television,
