This book investigates architecture as a form of diplomacy in the context of the Second World War at six major European international and national expositions that took place between 1937 and 1959. The volume gives a fascinating account of architecture assuming the role of the carrier of war-related messages, some of them camouflaged while others quite frank. The famous standoffs between the Stalinist Russia and the Nazi Germany in Paris 1937, or the juxtaposition of the USSR and USA pavilions in Brussels 1958, are examples of very explicit shows of force. The book also discusses some less known - and more subtle - messages, revealed through an examination of several additional pavilions in both Paris and Brussels; of a series of expositions in Moscow; of the Universal Exhibition in Rome that was planned to open in 1942; and of London's South Bank Exposition of 1951: all of them related, in one way or another, to either an anticipation of the global war or to its horrific aftermaths. A brief

discussion of three pre-World War II American expositions that are reviewed in the Epilogue supports this point. It indicates a significant difference in the attitude of American exposition commissioners, who were less attuned to the looming war than their European counterparts. The book provides a novel assessment of modern architecture's involvement with national representation. Whether in the service of Fascist Italy or of Imperial Japan, of Republican Spain or of the post-war Franquista regime, of the French Popular Front or of socialist Yugoslavia, of the arising FRG or of capitalist USA, of Stalinist Russia or of post-colonial Britain, exposition architecture during the period in question was driven by a deep faith in its ability to represent ideology. The book argues that this widespread confidence in architecture's ability to act as a propaganda tool was one of the reasons why Modernist architecture lent itself to the service of such different masters. Packed in its dense, historic city centers, Italy holds some of the most prized architecture and art in the world, with which planners and politicians have had to negotiate as they struggle to cope with massive migration from the countryside to the city. Early modern architecture coincided with a sustained drive to transform a country that was still primarily rural into a modern industrial state, and throughout the twentieth century, architects in Italy have attempted to define the role of architecture within a capitalist economy and under diverse political systems. Peter Eisenman is one of the most controversial protagonists of the architectural scene, who is known as much for his theoretical essays as he is for his architecture. While much has been written about his built works and his philosophies, most books focus on one or the other aspect. By structuring this volume around the concept of form, Stefano Corbo links together Eisenman's architecture with his theory. From Formalism to Weak Form: The Architecture and

Philosophy of Peter Eisenman argues that form is the sphere of mediation between our body, our inner world and the exterior world and, as such, it enables connections to be made between philosophy and architecture. From the start of his career on, Eisenman has been deeply interested in the problem of form in architecture and has constantly challenged the classical concept of it. For him, form is not simply a cognitive tool that determines a physical structure, which discriminates all that is active from what is passive, what is inside from what is outside. He has always tried to connect his own work with the cultural manifestations of the time: firstly under the influence of Colin Rowe and his formalist studies; secondly, by re-interpreting Chomsky's linguistic theories; in the 80's, by collaborating with Derrida and his de-constructivist approach; more recently, by discovering Henri Bergson's idea of Time. These different moments underline different phases, different projects, different programmatic manifestos; and above all,

an evolving notion of form. Taking a multi-disciplinary approach based on the intersections between architecture and philosophy, this book investigates all these definitions and, in doing so, provides new insights into and a deeper understanding of the complexity of Eisenman's work.

Il primo capitolo è dedicato all'analisi dei luoghi, alla descrizione della nuova costruzione, mettendole anche in relazione con il pensiero di Le Corbusier, infine nell'ultima parte vengono analizzate alcune delle più importanti analisi condotte dai maggiori critici del mondo. La parte centrale di questo capitolo affronta complessi problemi relativamente al rapporto tra il modulator impiegato nella progettazione dell'altare e altre simbologie, derivanti dal sogno di Giacobbe. In conclusione di questo capitolo viene affrontato il tema simbolico e allegorico delle porte della cappella, oltre ad altri elementi di arredo come i banchi, lo spazio sacro e i campanili, che in questa opera svolgono un compito centrale nella costituzione dello spazio interno ed esterno della cappella. Va segnalato il ruolo formale che svolgono i prospetti della cappella stessa: se confrontati tra la posizione naturale e quella ruotata di 90°, emerge nuovamente la forma dell'orecchio, come in precedenza era stato osservato per quanto attiene alla pianta della cappella. Il terzo capitolo affronta il ruolo

dell'orecchio nell'Annunciazione, comparando questo punto cruciale della fede cattolica con altre religioni: si osserva come l'orecchio assuma ruoli inusitati fino a divenire un organo sessuale. La correlazione tra Annunciazione e orecchio viene analizzata con grande sapienza, al fine di comprendere il simbolismo che tale organo ha entro la cappella di Ronchamp. Nell'ultima parte del capitolo viene affrontato un altro aspetto del suono, quello relativo alla musicalità, espressa da Le Corbusier nelle facciate della cappella grazie al sapiente giuoco nella disposizione e nella calibrazione delle dimensioni delle finestre. Nell'ultimo capitolo, infine, l'autore esamina la possibilità che l'idea guida del progetto della cappella di Ronchamp sia basata sul suono come elemento da cui prende origine il tutto; a questo fine la genesi progettuale sarebbe da ritrovarsi in alcuni disegni esplicativi che inglobano la forma di una campana nella pianta della capella. *Architecture of Italy* Gangemi Editore Spa
