The immense popularity of Dr. Crement's first book, *A\*\*hole No More*, has led him to write a sequel on the subject, *A\*\*holes Forever*. In this new book, Dr. Crement examines those sad cases in which the disease of assholism has become so severe that

there is seemingly no cure for it. These are people who have chosen to be assholes forever. Dr. Crement laments that even though the cure for assholism is now well known -- thanks to *A\*\*hole No More* -- there are people who refuse to recognize their chronic assholism as a disease and seek help. Dr. Crement lists the types of people and groups most prone to being assholes forever, documenting the tricks they use to take advantage of everyone else -- and explains what to do to spot 'em and to stop 'em.

Until recently, it was almost impossible to find anyone who would take the disease of assholism seriously. Compulsively rude treatment of others was viewed only as a character flaw, not as an addiction over which the asshole had no real control. Dr. Crement, who began his career in proctology but has since switched to psychiatry, corrects this glaring omission with this encyclopedic treatment of assholism. The book is written primarily as a self-help guide for recovering assholes -- people who have come to grips with their addiction and are trying to learn what it means to be a decent human being. But it also includes a thorough description of the causes of assholism and the terrible waste this menace creates.
